Parivartan sanstha emerged as a registered development organization after several decades of individual development contribution from founder board members across various rural parts of Maharashtra. To expand the rural development work and making it more effective for the welfare of poor sections of population, likeminded individual development functionaries came together to form Parivartan in year 1998. Since its inception, Parivartan has outlined a the need of in-depth study of various development issues like poverty, environmental degradation, under development of weaker sections like children and women for constructive reform and policy advocacy of same.

At present, Parivartan team has five full time development workers and six dedicated volunteers. Organization also receives facilitation and support from various Government officers and development functionaries from other organizations. Parivartan has rented office with required furniture and infrastructure located at Ahmedpur, Tehsil. The organization has been actively working in forty villages for holistic development of various weaker sections like small farmers, landless laborers, Dalits women in distress, children, tribal, and backward sections.

Ahamedpur has been one of the most backward regions of latur district of Maharashtra. Out of total population, only 30% of the population is economically sound enjoys quality of living. The rest 70% of the populations consists of landless labors, small farmers, women, children, economically and socially weaker sections. The situation of these vulnerable social segments has been very distressful. In addition, around 80% agriculture in Latur district is rain-fed. Predominantly, economically less developed; Latur district has less industrialization and geographically consists of hilly terrain. The Ahmadpur block has been less served by the cooperative movement as there is only one cooperative sugar factory. There is restricted employment generation despite having more than 60% population belongs to landless laborers category. Realistically speaking, seasonal agriculture, infrequent government induced employment generation and some activities due to the only available cooperative sugar factory are the only sources of income for the under developed population. The demand supply equation has been skewed and the region highlights need of multiple employment generation initiatives. The decline in human development due to less economic opportunities has been skewed and the region highlights need of multiple employment generation initiatives. The decline in human development due to less economic opportunities has been severe problem which need immediate attention. The women population in Ahamedpur block carries more degraded development status as they end up less served by the development activities due to gender restrictions and prevalent property and less social mobility. Seasonal livelihood migration has been another phenomenon that shows the underdeveloped status of Ahamedpur region. On account of unavailability of employment and economic generation activities, majority of the backward social sections, Dalits and landless laborers migrate for seasonal Sugar Cane cutting activities to other regions. The impact of seasonal migration on the education of children is obvious as most of them end up as dropout.

This grave situation demands employment generation at local level for educated and unemployed youth, women and other eligible adults. This will led to support to the household income as well as some kind of economic self reliance. The economic opportunity will have an instrumental role in keeping the dropout situation under control due to economic gains. A collective discussion especially with stakeholders from community advocated the need of village based self employment. Parivartan's vocational training interventions have started in this manner. After applying professional intervention strategy Parivartan has decided client specific strategy for self employment and income generation interventions. With this approach, Parivartan feels that women specific interventions should have suitable training of activities like training whereas the young population will be benefited by computer skills training. At present Parivartan has been consistently working for the employment generation activities for various weaker and excluded sections to control the distressful migration and educational dropout.

FUTURE PLANS OF PARIVARTAN SANSTHA

Parivartan is aimed at a knowledge-based intervention strategy based activities for sustainable community development of vulnerable sections of society like Tribal, Nomadic Tribes, Vimukta Jati, Dalit, Landless laborers, Small Framers, Children and women.

- Economic and social development of women through the self help group based interventions.
- Legal advice and assistance through a well established facilitation activity for Deserted women.
- Mainstreaming of the education excluded child labour.
- Interventions of increasing participation of villagers in Panchayati Raj Activities.
- Various interventions for employment generations and reduction of distressful livelihood migration.
- Increasing the performance of government schemes through awareness and implementation.
- Rural sanitation and health awareness programs on big scale to cover total project area.
- Working for an equitable right of women in village based Natural Resource system.
- Advocacy and legal action for preventing Land encroachment and rights entitlement to weaker men and women.
- Creating federations of women self help groups.
- Creating awareness among Dalit social groups about the atrocities and the legal education training for the same to develop anaccountable citizenship among the deprived sections.
- Conducting youth specific entrepreneurship trainings and resource centre for rural youth
